The Certified Floodplain Manager (CFM) Exam will be offered on October 3, 2014, for those who are interested in taking it.

Location:

Lacey, WA

Course Description:

This course is designed for local officials responsible for administering their local floodplain management ordinance. The course will focus on the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP) and concepts of floodplain management, maps and studies, ordinances administration, and the relationship between floodplain management and flood insurance.

Target Audience:

Local officials responsible for administering local floodplain management ordinances, including but not limited to floodplain management administration, building inspectors, code enforcement/zoning officers, planners, city/county managers, attorneys, engineers, and public works officials. Federal/State/Regional floodplain managers are also encouraged to attend. The course is designed for those officials with less than three years of floodplain management experience.

FEMA Form 119-25-1 Application:

Applicants will need to put their Student Identification (SID) in place of their social security number. If you do not yet have a SID, just follow these three simple steps to obtain one:

Step 1: To register, go to <https://cdp.dhs.gov/femasid/>

Step 2: Click on the "Need a FEMA SID?" button on the right side of the screen.

Step 3: Follow the instructions and provide the necessary information to create your account.
