FEMA Announces 90/10 Cost Share Adjustment

March 18th, 2022

FEMA Administrator Deanne Criswell announced on March 18th, 2022, that additional disaster funding is available to all states, tribal nations and territories with Presidential major disaster and emergency declarations occurring in 2020 and 2021.

On March 15, President Joseph R. Biden, Jr. signed "H.R. 2471, Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2022" into law, which granted a minimum 90% federal cost share for any emergency or major disaster declaration occurring or having an incident period beginning between Jan.1, 2020 and Dec. 31, 2021.

Specifically, the enacted law authorizes an increase to the standard 75% federal cost share to at least 90% for Public Assistance, the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program and specified Individual Assistance programs authorized under emergency disaster and major declarations.

The assistance authorized as part of H.R. 2471 is in addition to the <u>President's announcement on March 1</u>, 2022, which extended the full federal cost share to 100% to support all eligible work under COVID-19 emergency and major disaster declarations through July 1, 2022.

From January 2020 through December 2021, FEMA responded to disasters that have impacted millions of Americans.
