President Joseph R. Biden, Jr. Amends Federal Cost-Share for Alaska

FEMA Administrator Deanne Criswell announced on September 29th that President Joseph R. Biden, Jr. made additional disaster assistance available to the state of Alaska to supplement state, tribal, and local recovery efforts in the areas affected by a severe storm, flooding, and landslides from Sept. 15-20, 2022.

The President authorized the federal cost-share for emergency protective measures to be increased from 75% to 100% for the first 30 days of the incident period. In the major <u>disaster declaration issued</u> for the state of Alaska, federal funding was made available for public assistance, the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP), and other needs assistance for total eligible costs.

Individuals and households in the following designated counties are eligible to apply for financial and direct services: Bering Strait

Regional Educational Attendance Area, Kashunamiut Regional Educational Attendance Area, Lower Kuskokwim Regional Educational Attendance Area, and the Lower Yukon Regional Educational Attendance Area. A PDF map of the areas where Individual and Public Assistance is currently available can be viewed here.

State, local, tribal, and territorial governments and certain private non-profit organizations in these designated counties are eligible for assistance for emergency work and the repair or replacement of disaster-damaged facilities.

This training will introduce this new flood insurance rating methodology and take a closer look at the rating factors used to determine a buildings' risk of flooding and the cost to insure that risk. This webinar will also provide information on additional training resources, discuss recent experience with the new rating methodology, and provide tips for success. This training is open to all.
