Purchasing Under FEMA Awards Training: Prepare Before a Disaster



FEMA's Grant Programs Directorate (GPD) is offering a series of one-hour trainings on the federal procurement rules applicable to recipients and subrecipients purchasing under a FEMA grant award. Knowing the federal procurement rules when purchasing goods and services under a FEMA grant program will help increase your chance of securing and keeping the funding you need.

Keep in mind that different sets of rules apply depending on your entity type, the cost of your goods or services, contract type, and procurement method. In addition to understanding these sets of rules, it's also important to become familiar with the general elements of the procurement process and discover resources to help you avoid common mistakes.

The Prepare Before Disaster training will be held on **March 15th, 2023, from 10:00 – 11:00 a.m. (PST)**. This training focuses on contracting actions recipients and subrecipients can take to prepare before a disaster strikes and addressing the procurement rules applicable during this time. This training is appropriate for FEMA award recipients and subrecipients, including state, local, tribal, and territorial government personnel; nonprofit organization staff; eligible private entities; and other non-federal entities.



PSPR2 Seminar Series: Mass Casualty Impact & Recovery

The Oregon Department of Emergency Management's (OEM) Public Private Partnership (P3) program managers of Idaho, Oregon, Alaska, and Washington (in partnership with the Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) and the private sector), have developed the Private Sector Preparedness Response and Recovery (PSPR2) Seminar Series. The first series, entitled "*Mass Casualty Impact & Recovery*," will examine how businesses can better prepare, respond, and recover from active shooter and other mass casualty events.



Each 90-minute seminar will include subject matter experts

from business and the government sharing critical infrastructure best practices, valuable lessons, and planning resources and tools to assist with mass casualty impact and recovery. This series is designed for companies and organizations interested in enhancing their knowledge and understanding of the impact and recovery of a mass casualty event. The audience is any business or partner interested in learning more, and the series will be open nationally. Courses are not cumulative and may be taken individually. Each course counts toward continuing education with CEU credits.

FEMA Listening Session: Grants Applications & Grants Management | HHPD & SA



The Bipartisan Infrastructure Law increases funding for FEMA dam safety with \$585 million for the Rehabilitation of High Hazard Potential Dams (HHPD) Grant, \$148 million for the State Assistance (SA) Grant, and \$67 million total for operations and support. Listening sessions will help develop the goals for this funding and the steps necessary to accomplish these goals.

These listening sessions will alternate between being hosted virtually and in-person (depending on the topic and timing), with the next session occurring virtually on March 7th, 2023, from 12:00 - 1:00 p.m. (PST).

The overall goals of the stakeholder engagement process are to: understand the needs of the stakeholders this program is intended to support; provide opportunities for meaningful input to shape decisions and outcomes on program design,

components, and products; ensure that the unique challenges of related to dams faced by disadvantaged communities and tribes are well understood and incorporated into solutions; and identify the challenges future climatic issues pose to dam safety.
